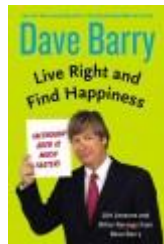

Bee delivers hilarious essays on everything from her parents' views on religion and sex to her pre-"Daily Show" stint as a Japanese anime character. (2010)



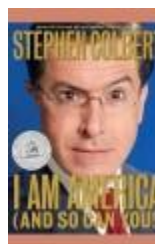
***Running with Scissors* by Augusten Burroughs**

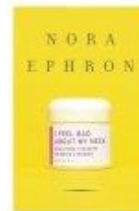


***Sister, Mother, Husband, Dog* by Delia Ephron** (Fiction Ephron)

***Bossypants* by Tina Fey** (92 Biography Fey)

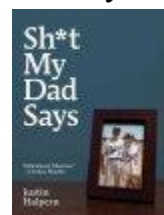

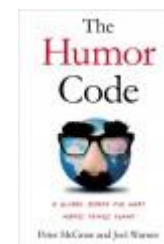
***Let's Pretend This Never Happened* by Jenny Lawson** (92 Biography Lawson)

The creator of the *Bloggess* blog shares humorous stories from her life, including her awkward upbringing in Texas and her relationship with her husband. (2012)



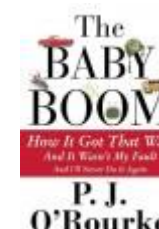
***The Humor Code: A Global Search for What Makes Things Funny* by Peter McGraw**

Part road-trip comedy and part social science experiment, a scientist and a journalist travel the globe to discover the secret behind what makes things funny. (2014)



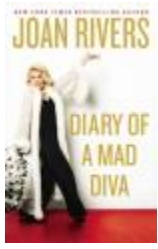

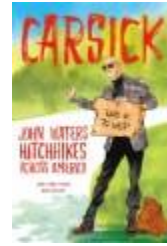


***Yes, Please* by Amy Poehler** (92 Biography Poehler)

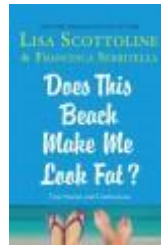
Carsick by John Waters
