



**Fiction Bowen – Queen of Hearts** (2014)

In addition to her popular **Constable Evans series**, Bowen also pens the **Royal Spyness series**. Lady Georgiana Rannoch, thirty-fifth in line for the British throne, takes on house cleaning jobs in disguise to supplement her income and gets involved in mystery. She is often called upon by the Queen

to help out with family issues.

**Fiction Bradley – The Chimney Sweepers Come to Dust** (2015)

Precocious 11-year-old **Flavia de Luce** lives with her father and two older sisters at Buckshaw, the family's country house in the small village of Bishop's Lacey. Her hobby is chemistry, but she is drawn into detection when she finds a dead body among the cucumbers in the garden in the first series entry –at **The Sweetness the Bottom of the Pie**. Set in 1950s England, these charming novels are full of quaint local characters, droll humor, period detail, and twisting plots.





**Fiction Carlisle – The Book Stops Here** (2014)

The **Bibliophile Mysteries** feature rare book expert Brooklyn Wainwright, whose bookbinding and restoration skills help her uncover secrets, treachery, and murder. In this entry Brooklyn is thrilled to be appearing on the San Francisco edition of the hit TV show *This Old Attic* as a rare-book

expert and appraiser.

**Fiction Childs – Scorched Eggs** (2014)


Set in the Midwestern town of Kindred, is the egg-themed Cackleberry Club, a cafe which includes a book nook and a knitting nest. Widows Suzanne, Toni, and Petra run the cafe and get involved with murder. Recipes included. (also, **The Tea Shop** mysteries and **The Scrapbook** series)



Cleo Coyle's blend of mystery and coffee in the **Coffee House** series is a satisfying brew. Protagonist Clare Cosi and her ex-husband Matt Allegro run the Village Blend coffeehouse in Greenwich Village. NYPD detective Mike Quinn is one of Clare's best customers, sometime boyfriend, and investigative partner. Includes recipes.

**Fiction Graves – Bat in the Belfry** (2013)

Eastport, Maine is home to mystery writer Sarah Graves, and her fictional character, amateur sleuth Jacobia "Jake" Tiptree. Jake lives in an 1823 Federal House which is constantly undergoing renovation. Jake is a single mother with a teenaged son. The series, **Home Repair Is Homicide**, is full of home repair tips and Maine color. **Winter at the Door** (2015) is the first in a new series featuring **Lizzie Snow**, who is a character in *Bat in the Belfry*.




**Fiction Hart – Death at the Door** (2014)



**Fiction Heley – Murder in Time** (2014) **Ellie Quicke**



Melanie Cooper and Angie DeLaura are living out their dream as owners of the Fairy Tale Cupcakes bakery. However, life in Cozieland is not without incident and soon Mel and Angie are investigating murders. (also, *Library Lovers* mysteries)



**Fiction Winspear – A Dangerous Place (2015)**

*Maisie Dobbs*, former ladies' maid, student at Cambridge University's Girton College for women, nurse on French battlefields during World I, and lover of a young doctor who mysteriously disappeared, opens her own private investigator's office in 1929. Maisie investigates

disappearances, homicides, and other crimes in this series which portrays London in the early 1930s, during the Great Depression, and between the two world wars.
