



Fiction Allen – *First Frost*


Fiction Flagg – *The All-Girl Filling Station's Last Reunion*


Fiction Karon – *Come Rain or Come Shine*


Fiction Macomber – *Last One Home*


Fiction Morton – *The Forgotten Garden*

She doesn't know her name, and the only clue to her identity is a book of fairy tales tucked inside a white suitcase. When the girl, called Nell, grows up, she starts to piece together bits of her story, but just as she's on the verge of going to England to trace the mystery to its source, her granddaughter, Cassandra, is left in her care.



Fiction Penny – *The Nature of the Beast*

Set in and around the Quebec village of Three Pines this series features Armand Gamache of the Surete du Quebec, a large, quiet man in his mid-fifties, who likes nothing more than walking through Parc Mont Royal with his beloved wife Reine-Marie and his dog. Gamache's loyal deputy is rakish young Jean Guy Beauvoir. Penny writes classic British mysteries, complete with red herrings, a large cast of suspects, and a dramatic final revelation.






Fiction Simonson – *The Summer Before the War* (2016)

East Sussex, 1914. It is the end of England's brief Edwardian summer, and everyone agrees that the weather has never been so beautiful. Hugh Grange, down from his medical studies, is visiting his Aunt Agatha, who lives with her husband in the small, idyllic coastal town of Rye. Agatha's husband works in the Foreign Office, and she is certain he will ensure that the recent

saber rattling over the Balkans won't come to anything. And Agatha has more immediate concerns; she has just risked her carefully built reputation by pushing for the appointment of a woman to replace the Latin master.




Fiction Smith – *I Capture the Castle*
