

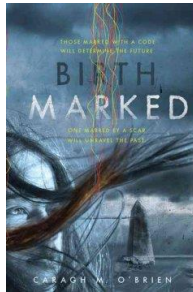
Fiction Ee – *AngelFall* (2012)

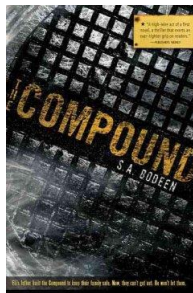
YA SciFi Fantasy Bick – *Ashes* (2011)

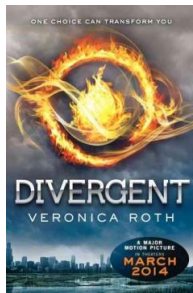
YA SciFi Fantasy O'Brien – *Birthmarked* (2010)

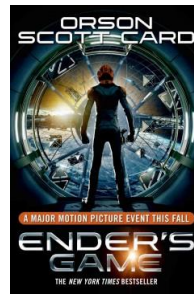
YA SciFi Fantasy Bodeen – *The Compound* (2009)

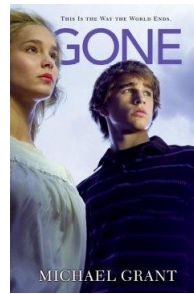
YA SciFi Fantasy Roth – *Divergent* (2011)

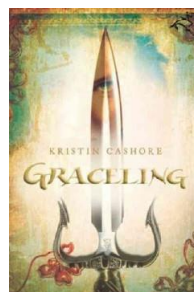
YA SciFi Fantasy Card – *Ender's Game* (2013)

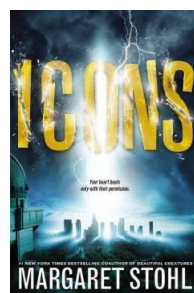
YA SciFi Fantasy Cashore – *Graceling* (2008)

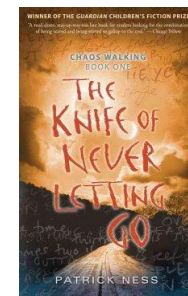
YA SciFi Fantasy Collins – *Gregor the Overlander* (2004)

After an alien force known as the Icon colonizes Earth, decimating humanity, four surviving teenagers must piece together the mysteries of their pasts--in order to save the future.



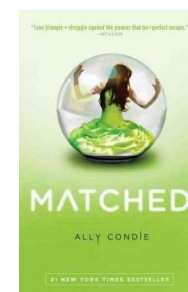
YA SciFi Fantasy Ness – *The Knife of Never Letting Go* (2009)

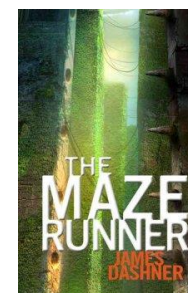
YA SciFi Fantasy Lu – *Legend* (2013)

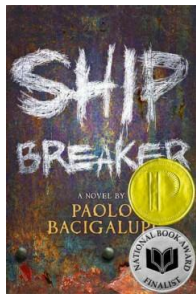
YA SciFi Fantasy Dashner – *The Maze Runner* (2009)

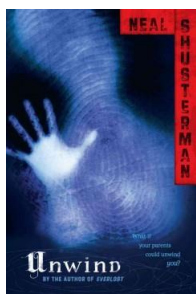
YA SciFi Fantasy Bowman – Taken (2013)

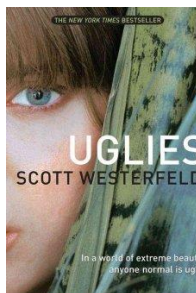
YA SciFi Fantasy Charbonneau – The Testing (2013)

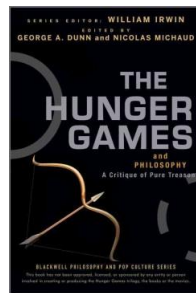
YA SciFi Fantasy Shusterman – Unwind (2007)

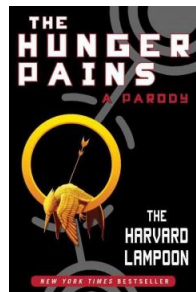
813.6 Collins – The Hunger Games and Philosophy: A Critique of Pure Treason (2012)
